NEW TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

Teachers should be advised that the travel restrictions are changing quickly and may wish to adjust their travel plans accordingly. As of today, any traveller arriving in Canada by air will be subjected to a Covid test on arrival and those vaccinated must quarantine while awaiting a negative test result. Those unvaccinated must quarantine for the full 14 days and undergo a test on Day one and Day eight. Travellers may quarantine in a designated facility or in another suitable location.

Additional measures have been put into place in regards to the Omicron variant. More information found <u>here</u>.

in their first five (5) years of teaching, as well as teacher candidates. Responsibilities of the facilitators

- Proof of vaccination is required for the in-person event.
- Prepare and present **a 60-minutes or a 90-minutes workshop**:
- Have experience as a workshop facilitator, have expertise in the content area, and is comfortable
 with the use of Zoom (if applying for the virtual event).

IMPORTANT NOTES

- . Facilitators will not receive an honorarium.
- 2. Facilitators <u>will not receive</u> any Zoom training prior to the conference (if applying for the virtual event).
- 3. The selection of workshops will be made during the week of December 13, and you will be contacted by email to confirm your workshop.
- 4. Preference will be given to facilitators who are BCTF members.
- 5. Due to the high attendance, some rooms will be set up in a classroom style.
- 6. Expenses will be reimbursed for **ONLY one (1) facilitator** (Leave of Absence Request (LOA), travel, per diem and accommodation if applicable).
- 7. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks will be provided during the in-person event.

What are X and Y blocks?

The secondary schools have created extra blocks to try to accommodate more options for students. The X block begins the school day at 7:30 am. The Y block extends the school day until 4:00 pm. If you are called in to TTOC at the secondary level and are asked to take an X or Y block, look carefully at your schedule. You should be teaching no more than 2.5 to 3 hours for a half day or 5 hours for a full day. If your schedule asks you to teach beyond that amount of time, you are eligible to be paid extra for the assignment. You will have to call HR to be sure this happens, however. If you have questions or are not sure if your assignment qualifies, feel free to call us at the office.
